CLASSROOM ENVIRONMENT / ROUTINES

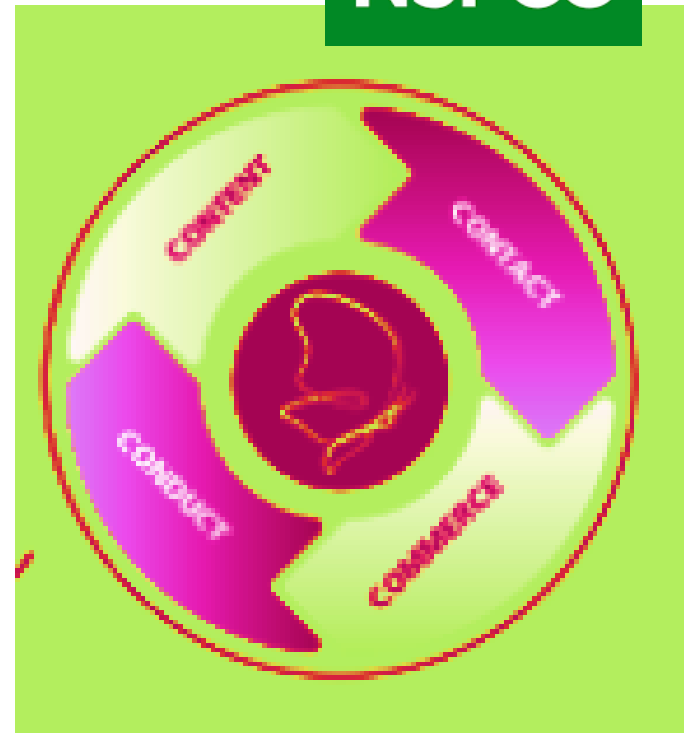
