#### **PHONICS**



- Essential Letters and Sounds
- Child must be able to decode the book no graphemes they haven't been taught yet - our school stock has been very carefully linked to each week's teaching
- Importance of over-learning should re-read the book 4 times over the week.
- We will also send a 'sharing book' which children will not be able to decode. This should be read by the adult to the child
- Please record comments in reading record as usual
- All change books on a Friday
