Welcome to Reception

Dear Parents & Carers,

Welcome to St. Peter's School! We are delighted to be able to share your child's first experience of school with you and are looking forward to an exciting year ahead.

Firstly, we wanted to say well done to all the children for an excellent start! Starting school is a big adjustment, but we have been so impressed with their resilience, positivity and independence. You should all feel really proud.

This term, we will be focusing on getting to know the children and supporting them to learn the new routines, so that they are happy and settled in the classroom.

Morning Routine

We have started introducing our morning routine. The children will come in, find their name peg and hang up their coat, complete our self-registration board and complete a 'Busy Fingers' activity, which is based on developing their fine motor skills. Thank you for your support in encouraging them to enter the class independently.

Home Consolidation Activities

Each term, we will upload a Knowledge Organiser (explaining the different areas of learning) to the website and Google Classroom. These will offer ideas to help you to support your child further at home. We will share these with you at the New to Reception Parent meeting.

Google classroom

Your child will be sent home with log on details for Google Classroom. This is an online portal which we use to communicate with you all. Type in the web address (http://classroom.google.com) and then your child's username and password. Please log in as soon as possible so that we can begin using this with the class. If you have any issues logging on or have forgotten/lost log in details then please contact Jappy@stpeters.hers.sch.uk and Ms Potts will provide some assistance.

WOW moments:

We will set an assignment on Google classroom called WOW moments. You can use Google Classroom to send us photographs of any special events that your child may want to share such as a birthday, holiday or learning to ride a bike for the first time. We will then place the pictures up on our interactive whiteboard for the children to share with the class.

Topic for Autumn 1: Marvellous Me

Each half term we will be basing our learning on a topic. This term is focused around getting to know each other. We will be looking at the diversity of our families, the types

of homes we live in, the different countries our families are from and celebrating how we are all unique. As part of this we will be holding an International week on Monday 13th – Friday 17th October. Over the course of this week parents and or carers/extended family members can come in to share something about their home country/ a country that is special to them/or somewhere in the UK you have visited which is different to St Albans. This could be as simple as teaching us a song or reading a book in your language. Or it could be bringing in photographs of key landmarks or making a flag. If you are unable to come in, you can send your child in with items to talk about.

Topic for Autumn 2: Let's Celebrate

During this topic we will be learning about some religious festivals such as Diwali, Hanukkah and Christmas. As part of our Knowledge and Understanding curriculum we will be making comparisons and noticing how they may be different. If you have any photographs of your child celebrating any important festivals, we would love to see them. Additionally, if you would like to come in and talk to the children about any of these festivals then please let us know.

Phonics

St Peter's follow the Phonics scheme Essential Letters and Sounds. This means the children will begin learning initial sounds and practise the art of blending. You may wish to refer to our Knowledge Organiser for more information on key terminology. Please be aware that your child may not be ready to blend or read words at present. All children develop at different rates. Whilst all children will be given books, it may be that as a parent you are doing more of the reading and modelling. If your child is finding blending difficult, encourage them to say the sounds and then you can say the whole word to reinforce this. For example, s-a-t and you say 'sat'. We also use the techniques of 'My turn', 'Your turn'. You can model sounding out and saying the word and then the child repeats. It may be that you do this with one or two words to begin with. Reading the book together multiple times will support this. We will also be providing 'sharing' library books so that you and your child can read for enjoyment. More information will be provided at the parent meeting on Wednesday 8th October at 5.30pm. A few reminders:

- Please make sure everything is labelled, from jumpers to water bottles (including shoes), to avoid them being swapped or misplaced.
- Packed lunches must follow the schools healthy eating and nut free policy as we
 do have children in the school with severe allergies. This includes chocolate spread
 such as Nutella.
- The children are offered a selection of fruits and vegetables every morning for snack. They are also offered either milk or water.
