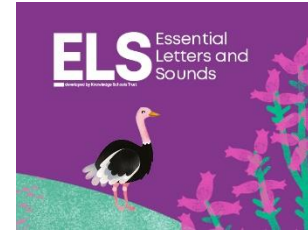

PHONICS



- Essential Letters and Sounds.
- Child must be able to decode the book - no graphemes they haven't been taught yet - our school stock has been very carefully linked to each week's teaching.
- Importance of over-learning - should re-read the book 4 times over the week.
- Children will have 2 books to take home to read.
- Please record comments in diary as usual.
- We may also use Oxford Owl e-books. We will organise a log on for all children as soon as we can.
- Changing reading books once the adult in school has read with them.

SPELLING

- New scheme – ELS (Essential Letters and Sounds) which links to the phonics scheme we use in EYFS and KS1
- Spelling scheme is taught throughout the school.
- 3 lessons weekly – 1 lesson re-capping and 1 weekly spelling test.
- Spelling and grammar content from the National Curriculum.

PE Kits – Navy Shorts, blue or white T shirt, Navy jogging bottoms, Navy Hoodie, Trainers

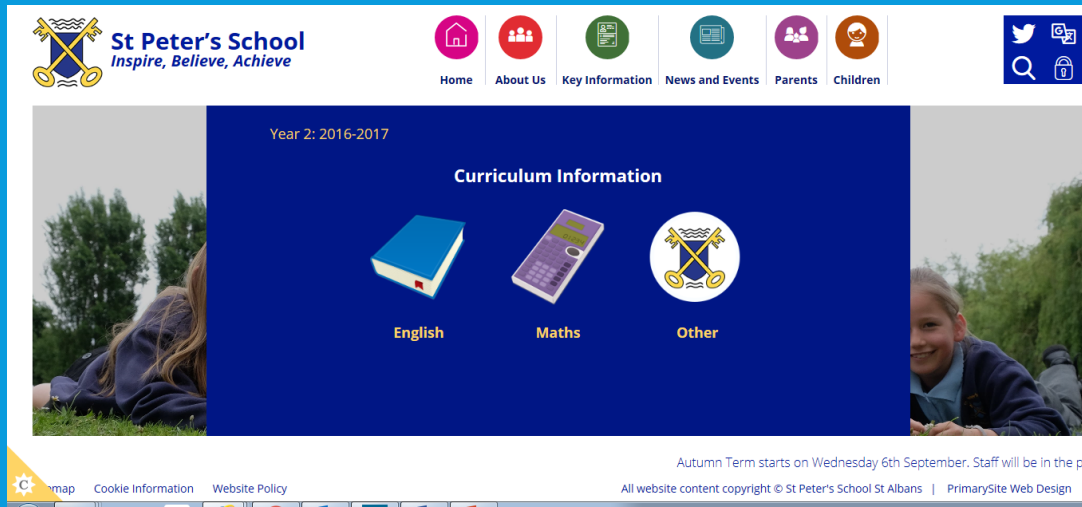
Jewellery cannot be worn except small stud earrings and watches, and must be removed for PE.

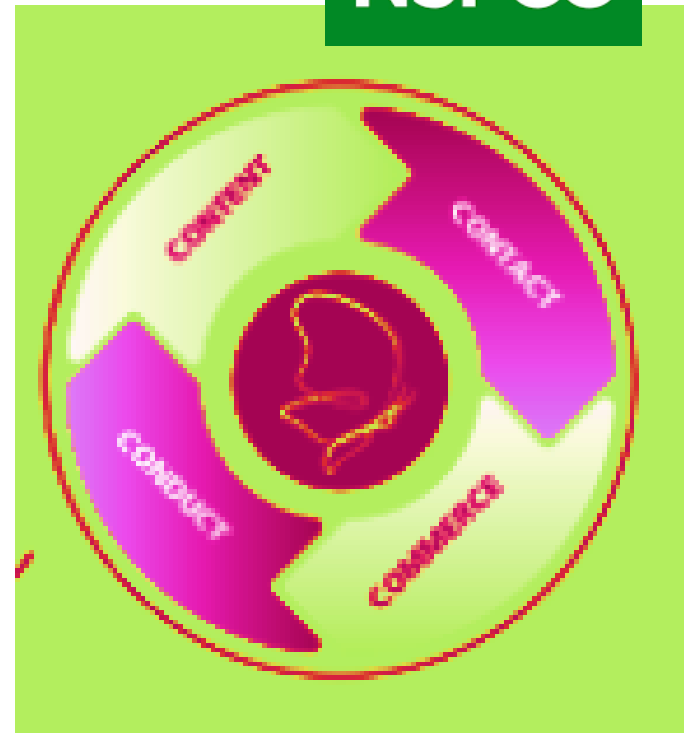
